

School of Hope Toileting Policy

Students enrolled at The School of Hope must be independent in taking care of all their bathroom needs.

Specifically stated:

- Children must wear traditional underwear to school, not pull-ups or other absorbent undergarments.
- Children must be able to independently recognize the need to use the toilet and get to the toilet in a timely manner without having “POTTY ACCIDENTS.”
- Children must be able to get on and off the toilet without assistance from an adult.
- Children must be able to use the toilet provided by the School of Hope
- Children must be able to pull pants up and down on their own.

Enforcement:

- If a child has a “POTTY ACCIDENT” at school, a report will be sent home indicating the date of the accident with a reminder of the policy written above.
 - This report will be signed by the teacher and an administrator and sent home to be signed by a parent.
 - The signed report must be returned to school the next day.
 - Should a second potty accident occur, the same procedure will be followed.
- In the event of a third “POTTY ACCIDENT” and/or the recognition that one of the above criteria is not being met, a meeting with the parents, teachers and administration will be scheduled to discuss if the School of Hope is the best suitable placement for the student.

**Personal Care-----
(for female students having reached puberty)**

- Female students, having attained puberty and in attendance at The School of Hope, must be able to independently care for their menstrual cycle personal needs should the need arise for the individual female. Understanding and following the proper way to dispose of all sanitary napkins or other personal hygiene items is a must! The School of Hope staff is prohibited from handling any sanitary napkin and/or personal need items.
- If your child receives ABA services, the company may be permitted to help the individual female in the process of changing a sanitary item. Please check with your ABA company to find out their policy concerning this matter.
