Instructions to Parents: In order to register your child for The School of Hope for the school year, the following items below must be provided. Admission forms may be downloaded from our website, (www.theschoolofhope.net), or picked up from the school. Admission forms may be submitted to the School of Hope office any day Monday-Friday. Complete the application and submit all required items in to The School of Hope office with the Application Fee. **After the application has been processed and reviewed, you will be contacted to schedule an assessment and interview time with the School of Hope Administration Team.**

Required for Admission:

- Student must be able to take care of personal needs independently!***
- Student Application Form
- Application Fee
- Copy of Student Birth Certificate
- Physician's Printed Diagnosis of Autism or notated as being on the Autism Spectrum
- Copy of Latest Report Card and Standardized Testing Results
- Developmental Readiness, Screening or Testing Results (Kindergarten)
- Copy of most recent IEP
- Copy of Student Immunization Record
- Student Evaluation Form

The items below are needed after the student is officially enrolled:

- Student Resource Fee and additional school forms provided at time of enrollment
- Health Assessment Form – for Kindergarten and Homeschooled Students only
A reminder to all parents that children must be 5 years of age by August 31 in order to enter Kindergarten. Exceptions may be granted by the Principal after a Developmental Readiness /Screening has been administered by The School of Hope.
